Pastor's Message

We have a rare occurence this year where Ash Wednesday falls upon Valentine's Day. We might presume repentance and romance are like... maybe not like oil and water but rather ash and water but they do better together than you might think. Both days are about love, albeit different kinds of love. Valentine's Day is more about romantic love while Ash Wednesday is a heart-rending love of sacrifice and devotion. The two holidays are definitely like a mixture of ash and water; it can burn.

The Old Testament text for Ash Wednesday declares,

Return to the Lord your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love; and he relents over disaster. (Joel 2:13)

It is not a romantic love God has for us; it is a steadfast love. The Hebrew word for God's abounding love (hesed; this is a guttural "h" so you need some rasp to pronounce it properly) is the love of the covenant God forged at Mt. Sinai. God's love is His faithfulness—His steadfastness—to His people even when they betray Him and turn to worshipping false idols. He will always be there offering His care and salvation. If your spouse is repeatedly unfaithful to you, you will find it more than difficult to accept him/her back. However, God makes the sacrifice of forgiving our guilt that we may welcomed when we return to Him. It is this sacrificial love that describes the love between spouses in a Christian marriage. When St. Paul says, "Husbands, love your wives," (Eph 5:25) he uses a word for love that is not an emotional kind of love (eros) but a self-sacrificing love (agapé). This is the kind of love Christ described as sacrificing one's life for one's friends (John 15:13). And Paul does not just say to husbands that they should love their wives, but husbands should be loving their wives "as Christ loved the Church and gave himself up for her." Our love in Christ, especially to our spouses (actual and potential), is a love of being willing to sacrifice of ourselves for our loved ones' wellbeing and our forgiveness of them. That is what God does for us in Christ Jesus and that is how we are made the bride of Christ, the Church.

There are many passages in the Bible about how the people of God have been "unfaithful brides" to God (e.g. Ezek 16; Hosea 3) but they all end with God offering forgiveness. This is love—not that we have been perfect and earned the romance of our partner, but that we have received the life of our spouse given in love to us. Love covers a multitude of sins (1 Pt 4:18). Let us encourage one another, including our spouses, to avoid sin while always being ready to show love in forgiveness, just as Christ gave us the example to do.

During Lent, we will be singing "Savior, When in Dust to Thee" (Hymn 419). The poetry of this hymn was written by Robert Grant, who was a lawyer by profession. The tune is named after a town in west Wales, Aberystwyth. It was composed by Joseph Parry, of Wales, who became the first professor of music at Aberystwyth University in the late 1800's.

The beauty of this hymn struck me while watching the series "The Crown" this past year. If you have seen this series, recall the graveside scene of the townspeople gathered beside all the graves of the school children who so sadly had their lives taken in the Aberfan mining tragedy of 1966, in South Wales. The entire community this hymn sang spontaneously at the mass grave site as a cry of hope and comfort for the unimaginable loss they were suffering. During Lent, we will sing many hymns, all of significance, but this particular Lenten hymn is an unbelievable human cry of pain, suffering, and begging of forgiveness and mercy; 'Hear our penitential cry!'

Tapestry Renewal

It has been reported by the LWML-C Treasurer that the production of the Tapestry is already over budget for this triennium with two more issues to come in the current subscription year. Changes will be made to avoid using mites to cover these costs:

1. The Spring 2024 issue will have four fewer pages, thus lowering both printing and postage

costs to some extent. Printing and mailing costs will be covered by funds other than mites on this one-time basis.

2. The Summer 2024 issue will NOT be published in print. That issue will be available online in some form although at this point, the details are still being worked out.

3. Looking to the 2024/25 subscription year, the board of directors has made some tweaks to the subscription rates and approved the production of three issues each year in place of four. Discussion regarding the possible publishing of an online fourth issue each year is ongoing.

The deadline date for renewals has changed from April 30 to March 15. This change was a request from the finance committee to make setting triennium budgets for the magazine easier. After this year, the deadline date will move to February 15 of each year with renewal forms available in November.

The renewal fee is \$15 for regular print, \$18 for large print. If you wish to continue your subscription or if you are a new subscriber, please forward your fees to Theodora Henry before March 15. A digital version is also available for \$10/year; forward fees and your email to Theodora.
